

CORH 206: Communicating Indigeneity

CORH 203 Communication in the Sciences

This course will explore how knowledge is constructed in the physical and natural sciences. Students will review and evaluate the structure, strategies, and components of scientific literature and other forms of communication in the sciences. They will practice communicating scientific information effectively to varied audiences - verbally, orally, and digitally - and presenting information precisely, creatively, and persuasively. CORH 205 Communication in the Social Sciences




