Overview

The Certificate and Minor in Communications and Rhetoric (CORH) offer a unique learning pathway, which helps students develop the academic, professional, and cross-disciplinary communication skills crucial to active citizenship in our increasingly interconnected world. Program goals include professionalization, interdisciplinarity, social justice, acessibility, and multimodality.

Developed CORH Programming 2021-2024:

CORH Certificate

To receive a CORH certificate, students in any UBCO undergraduate program can complete 15 credits through courses from four thematic interdisciplinary and relational clusters, and a final capstone project.

CORH Minor

To receive a CORH minor, students in the BA, BSc and BMgmt can complete 30 credits of CORH or CORH-approved courses, 12 at the 100-200 level and at least 18 at the 300-400 level, including the Communications Capstone.






