Fund History

First established in 2015 as the Aspire Learning and Teaching (ALT) Fund, the Office of the Provost and Vice-President, Academic created the ALT-2040 Fund following community consultations on the Aspire vision to fund innovative ideas and projects from UBC Okanagan faculty that transform student learning at the academic program level.

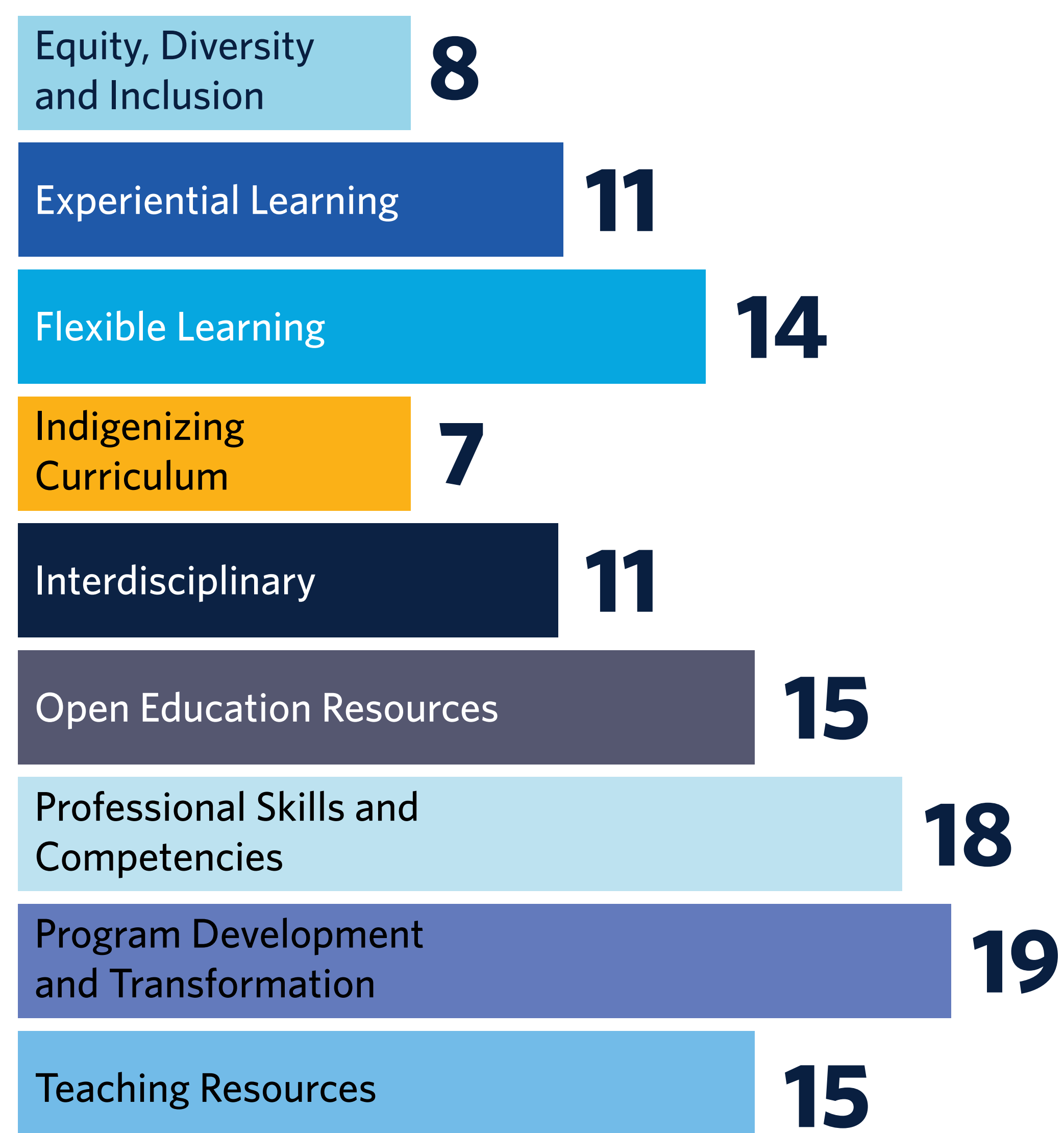
In 2019, the Fund was renamed to the ALT-2040 Fund to create a bridge from Aspire to Outlook 2040 and encourage a wider range of projects.

In recent years, additional funding streams have been added to support innovation in open education resources and emerging technology and media.

Priority Focus Areas

The ALT-2040 Fund's priority focus areas are selected annually to ensure alignment between teaching and learning innovation and UBC's key institutional priorities and commitments, including the Indigenous Strategic Plan, Inclusion Action Plan, StEAR Framework and Sustainability Strategy.
